A walk in Derbyshire has inspired this scape. From the meadow of *Hemianthus callitrichoides* 'Cuba' and swampy areas of *Eleocharis*, *Staurogyne* and *Lilaeopsis* marks the forest edge. Redwood covered in mosses, ferns and *Anubias* gives age to the forest, while young undergrowth of *Hemianthus micranthemoides* struggle for light underneath.

Tip! Moss tied to wood really gives age. Just remember, that most mosses will need to be re-tied now and then.

Technique

Volume:	60 L
Light:	ADA Solar 2 (2 x 36W T5) + 18W backlight
Gravel:	ADA system
Filter:	Eheim Professional 3e
CO2:	2 bubbles per second Via JBL kit
Fertiliser (weekly):	3ml ADA step 2, 5 drops green gain + 8 drops phyto
Maintenance (hours per week):	½-1
